### AFTER IMTC 2007

The annual Instrumentation and Measurement Technology Conference, sponsored by IEEE Instrumentation and Measurement Society (USA), was held this year in Poland. That conference, called IMTC 2007, was organized on May 1–3, 2007, in Warsaw Marriott Hotel, by the Executive Committee chaired by Roman Z. Morawski from the Faculty of Electronics and Information Technology, Warsaw University of Technology. The annual Instrumentation and Measurement Technology Conference, initiated in 1984, is considered to be the most important international event in the domain of measurement science and technology. It is a forum for exchange of technical and scientific ideas, oriented not only on the technical progress, but also on the development of international cooperation of both academic and industrial nature. All the papers presented during that conference are published in the proceedings, and the updated and extended versions of the best of them – in a special issue of the renowned journal *IEEE Transactions on Instrumentation and Measurement*. Among 23 IMTC conferences, organized in the period 1984–2006, 15 were held in USA, three in Italy, two in Canada, one in Belgium, one in Japan, and one in Hungary. After a thorough selection of offers, carried out in 2003–2004, the IMTC Board of Directors entrusted the organization of IMTC 2007 to the Polish community of measurement and instrumentation. Here are the most important statistical data characterizing the Warsaw conference:

- the number of submitted abstracts – 694;
- the number of accepted abstracts – 505;
- the number of papers in the final program – 477;
- the number of registered participants – 406;
- the number of represented countries – 44.

The largest groups of registered participants originated from Italy (70), USA (48), Poland (38), Spain (23) and Canada (19).
